### Reporting Your SAT Scores

Colleges and universities often require an official report of your SAT scores. Each time you take an SAT Program (either an SAT I or SAT II) test, the scores are added to your permanent SAT Program record at the College Board called a Score Report. When a college or scholarship program requires an official score, it is **your sole responsibility** to ask the College Board to send your Score Report to the specific institution. **You alone** determine whether or not any person or institution receives your Score Report. Your Score Report can be sent in a number of different ways. First and foremost, each time a test is taken, you may list up to eight colleges or scholarship program codes (the first four of which are sent free of charge) on the registration form. Your scores from that test and any previous tests will then be sent to the appropriate schools or programs.

It is to your benefit to take advantage of these opportunities to send your Score Report free of charge. Many students do not take advantage of this service and end up spending money sending scores to schools and scholarship programs at a later date. Some students may be concerned that they are not sure as to where they will apply and do not want to send out scores until they have made a final decision. Don't worry, anyone who receives your Score Report will not take the scores into consideration until your application is complete. This means that if you never end up applying, no one really looks at your scores.

As of June 2002 every SAT Program test that you take is placed on your Score Report. There is no longer the option of Score Choice on the SAT II where you can see your scores before you release them to your Score Report. However, some students may have taken an SAT II prior to June 2002. If you wish send your scores from an SAT II that you have taken with the Score Choice option, you must first release that score to your Score Report and then you must request that your Score Report be sent to your chosen school or scholarship program. Releasing your score does not send the score anywhere, it just includes it on your individual Score Report; this is an important distinction.
