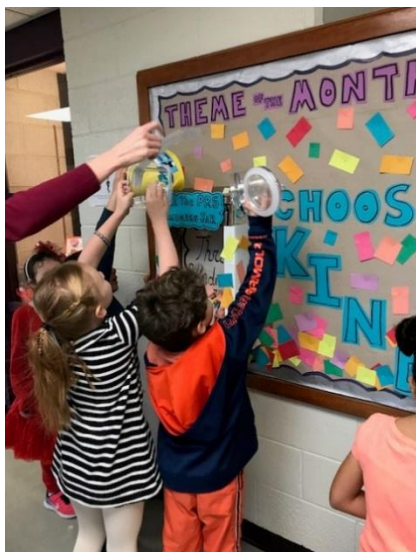


LEADING the NATION
